These accomplishments are a testament to the dedication of our faculty, staff, trainees, and community partners. The UCLA Tarjan Center remains steadfast in our commitment to:

- Increasing knowledge and skills for trainees in providing services, supports, and advocacy for people with developmental disabilities.
- Expanding professional workforce capacity to deliver high-quality, evidence-based services.
- Enhancing community capacity for equitable, inclusive postsecondary education, employment, and health services.
- Increasing access to multidisciplinary clinical services for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- Conducting impactful research that improves health and well-being.
- Promoting widespread adoption of research-supported practices, policies, and public awareness materials.

We are deeply grateful for the ongoing support of the Tarjan Advisory Committee, as well as our community and federal partners. Together, we continue to advance self-determination, inclusion, and quality of life for individuals with disabilities and their families.
