ELIGIBILITY

- Children **18-21 months of age** that has autism or have a developmental delay and screen positive for autism.

PARTICIPATION

- Study will help examine the language development window for children with autism using neural and behavioral measures at three time points:
18-21 months of age, 24-27 months of age, and 30-33 months of age.
No other visits are required for this study.
- The measures collected include demographic, medical history, and home environment questionnaires, wearing a vest to record language (LENA), EEG, a parent interview (Vineland), behavioral assessments, and a diagnostic assessment (only at 18-21 months and 30-33 months).
- Each time point will require around **9 hours**.
- The study will be done at your home.

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
